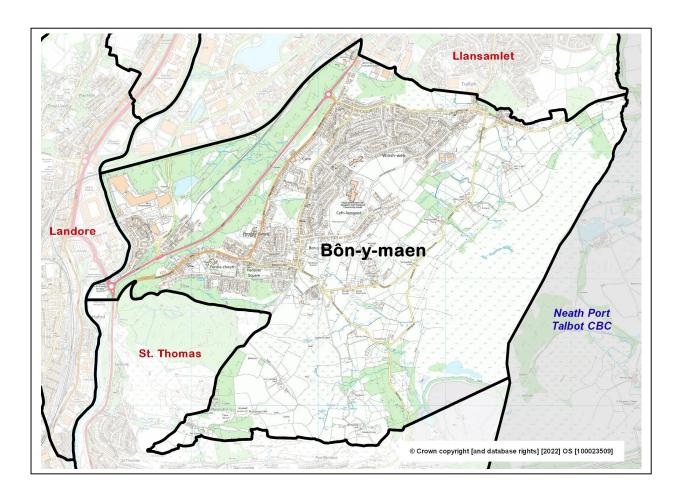


BÔN-Y-MAEN WARD PROFILE

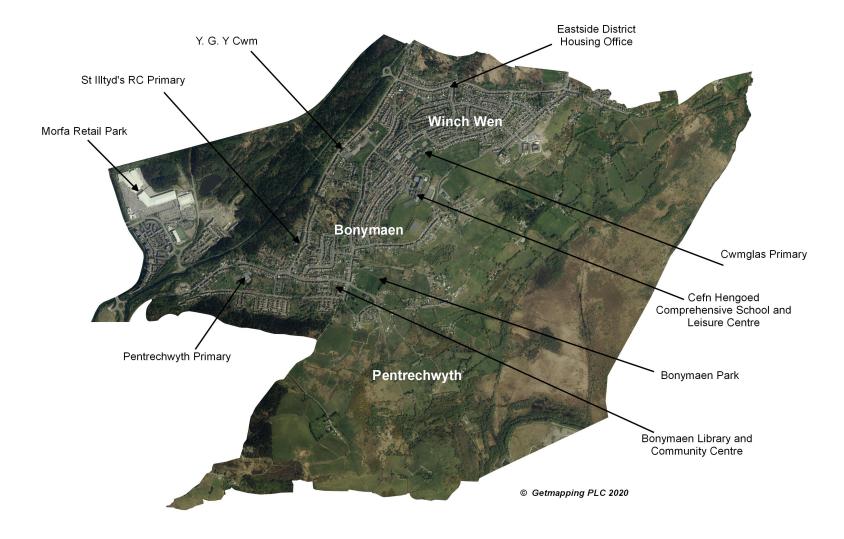
Information, Research & GIS (Strategic Delivery Unit), July 2023

Councillors (Electoral vote, May 2022): Mandy Evans (Labour – 1,056); Paul Lloyd (Labour – 1,072). *Turnout = 25%. Electorate: 5,564*.



- Location: Approximately 4 kilometres north east of Swansea city centre, consisting of the Bonymaen and Pentrechwyth localities.
- Adjacent Wards (Swansea): St Thomas, Landore, Llansamlet.
- Electoral Ward Review 2022: No change.
- Constituency Area (Welsh Government / UK Parliament): Swansea East.
- Population (Office for National Statistics rounded estimate, 2021 Census): 7,400.
- Area: 7.8 sq. km. Population Density: 953 people per sq.km. (ONS, 2021)
- **Employment** (former ward, ONS workplace estimate, 2021): 6,000. Major employers: Morrisons, B&Q, Morfa Retail Park businesses, Swansea Council (schools).

ABOUT THE WARD

Bôn-y-maen has experienced three main phases of housing development. The first was a product of the Industrial Revolution with terraced housing developed for workers in local collieries and industrial works, creating the expansion of several small villages in the ward.

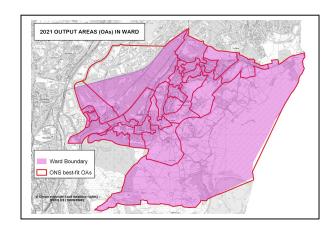
The second phase came after World War II with the development of a local authority housing estate of predominantly semi-detached dwellings. This second development phase, along with ribbon development over the years along the main roads (semi-detached/detached private dwellings), has served to link together many of the original villages.

In 2008, a new phase of dwelling construction begun on former industrial land along the River Tawe Corridor at Copper Quarter comprising a mix of 2, 3 and 4 bedroom houses and apartments, including units intended for first time buyers. Bôn-y-maen ward now has a range of property types from traditional terraced houses to larger properties and the Copper Quarter apartments.

Summary

- > 16th largest ward population in Swansea, and 14th highest population density (2021).
- Higher proportions (than Swansea average) of under 5s and people aged 25-44 years.
- Lower proportion of people with high level qualifications.
- Larger percentage (than Swansea average) of one person (under 66), cohabiting couple and lone parent family households.
- > Higher proportions of semi-detached and social rented housing.
- Above average percentage of economically active and employee residents, but also economically inactive long-term sick or disabled.

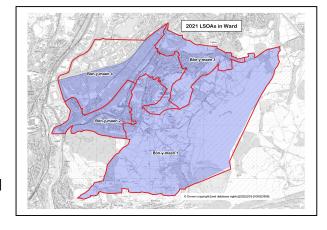
