
LLANGYFELACH WARD PROFILE



- Location: Approximately 9 kilometres north west of the city centre, and consisting of the Llangyfelach and Felindre localities.
- Adjacent Wards: Clydach, Morriston, Mynydd-bach, Penderry, Penllergaer, Pontlliw & Tircoed, Pontarddulais.
- Electoral Ward Review 2022: Changed consists of part of the former Llangyfelach electoral ward plus part of the former Mawr electoral ward.
- Constituency Area (Welsh Government / UK Parliament): Gower.
- Population (Office for National Statistics rounded estimate, 2021 Census): 2,700.
- Area: 35.6 sq. km. Population Density: 75 people per sq. km (ONS, 2021)
- **Employment** (former ward, ONS workplace estimate, 2021): 1,500. Major employers: Welsh Government regional offices, KSR Electronic Systems, Afon Tinplate.

ABOUT THE WARD

Llangyfelach is a mainly rural ward dissected by the M4 motorway. The present settlement pattern reflects the area's industrial activity from its early roots in coalmining through to the development of the Felindre tinplate works in the 1950s. Felindre, the site of the 2006 National Eisteddfod, is now the focus of ambitious redevelopment and investment plans. These plans will create a public sector backed business park (Parc Felindre) focussing on emerging industries such as high tech manufacturing and high level uses, together with a proposed new village that will become a live / work destination.

Llangyfelach locality, south of the M4, effectively merges with the north west of Mynyddbach and can also be linked to the area's heavy industrial expansion.

A large area of the ward, mainly north of the M4 and Parc Felindre, is rural in character, comprising largely open upland green space and scattered farm developments.



Summary

- 3rd smallest ward population in Swansea and 2nd lowest population density (2021).
- Relatively high proportion of people aged 45-64 years.
- Slightly lower proportions of people aged under 24 years.
- Higher proportions of people born in the UK, able to speak Welsh, and in good health.
- Larger percentage of couple households.
- Higher proportion of households in detached homes and owned tenure.
- Higher proportion of adults economically active employees and self-employed.
