
MAYALS WARD PROFILE

- Location: Approximately 6 kilometres west of Swansea city centre.

- Constituency Area (Welsh Government / UK Parliament): Swansea West.

ABOUT THE WARD


Mayals ward is located on the western side of Swansea Bay, mid-way between Swansea and Mumbles, and includes the Clyne Valley and part of the Gower Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty (AONB). This area has attracted the development of large detached homes since Victorian times and remains one of the most affluent and sought-after housing areas in Swansea.

However, it also contains the small Mill Gardens residential park homes site, the occasional apartment block and early Victorian two-storey terraced properties on Mumbles Road. The majority of the area's housing stock was developed between the 1950s and 1970s.

Summary

- 2nd smallest ward population in Swansea, and 10th lowest population density (2021).
- Relatively high proportion of people aged over 45, especially those aged 65+.
- Lower proportions of young children (0-4 years) and people aged 16-44 years.
- Higher proportions (than Swansea average) with higher level qualifications, in good health, and able to speak Welsh.
- Larger percentage of older and married or civil partnership couple households.
- Higher proportions of detached and owned outright housing.
- Above average proportion of economically inactive adults, particularly retired, and selfemployed.


