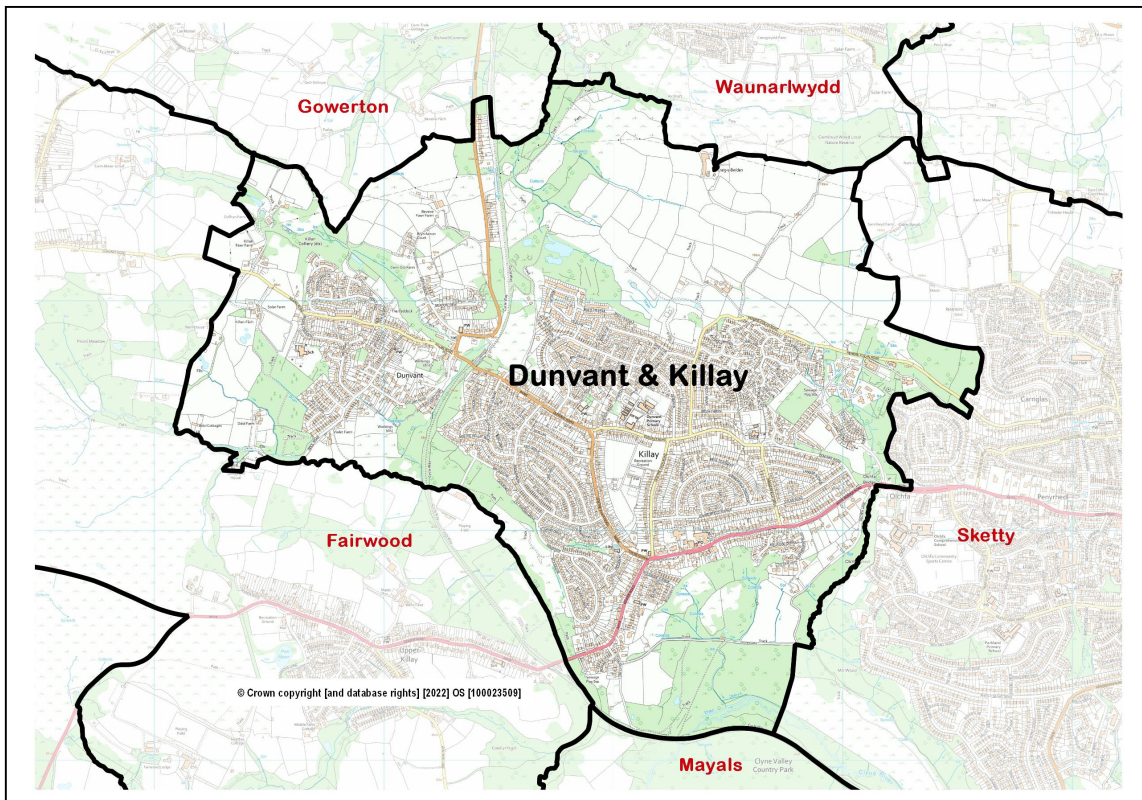

- **Location:** Approximately 6 kilometres west of the city centre, consisting of the Duvant and Killay localities.
- **Adjacent Wards:** Fairwood, Gowerton, Waunarlwydd, Sketty, Mayals.
- **Electoral Ward Review 2022:** Changed – the new ward consists of the former electoral wards of Duvant, Killay North and Killay South.
- **Constituency area (Welsh Government / UK Parliament):** Swansea West.
- **Population (Office for National Statistics rounded estimate, 2021):** 9,200.
- **Area:** 5.7 sq. km. **Population density:** 1,627 people per sq. km (ONS, 2021)
- **Employment (former wards combined, ONS workplace estimate, 2021):** 1,000. Major employers: Swansea Council (primary schools), Killay Shopping Precinct businesses.

ABOUT THE WARD

Dunvant grew as a small village around the coal mining that took place in the area during the 1800s. This period saw the development of some terraced housing. Ribbon development took place in the 1920s and 1930s along the main roads, but the majority of the housing was built from the 1960s onwards.

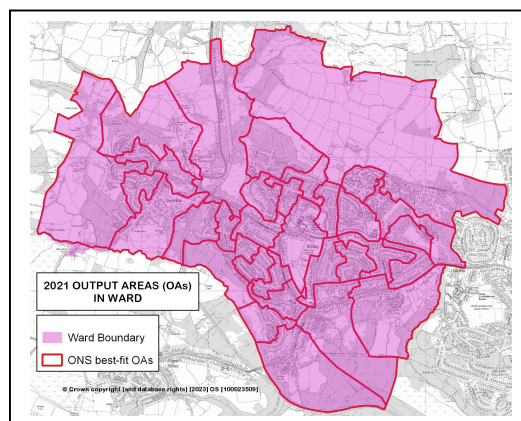
Killay is one of a string of Victorian hamlets on Gower Road that rapidly grew during the early 1900s and was subsequently absorbed by the western expansion of urban Swansea. It has since developed as an attractive residential suburb.

The ward contains a mix of housing types with a high proportion of semi-detached and detached dwellings; the majority of which are owner occupied.

Summary

- 10th highest ward population in Swansea, and 14th highest population density (2021).
- Lower proportions of young children (0-4 years) and people aged 25-44 years.
- Higher proportion of people aged over 45, especially those aged 65+.
- Percentage of people in good health above Swansea average.
- Higher percentage of adults with Level 4+ qualifications.
- High proportion of owner-occupied households, and lower levels of renting (private/social).
- Slightly above average proportions of adult residents self-employed or retired.

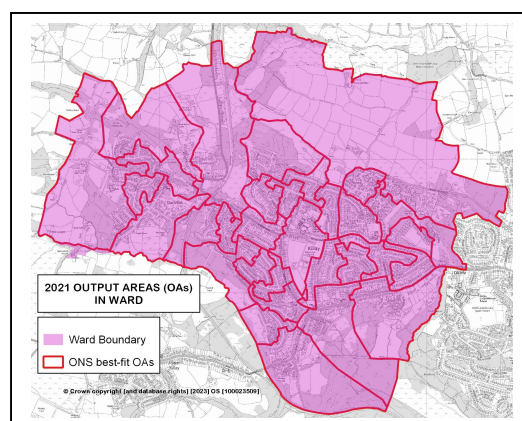
