1. **THIS NOTICE** is issued by the Council because it appears to them that there has been a breach of planning control under Section 187A of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 at the land described below. They consider that it is expedient to issue this Notice having regard to the provisions of the development plan and all other material planning considerations. The **annex** at the end of the Notice contains important additional information.

2. THE LAND TO WHICH THIS NOTICE RELATES

Development known as Bay View Court Sketty Swansea SA2 9JY in the City and County of Swansea ("the Land"), shown edged red on the plan appended hereto ("the Plan").

3. THE MATTERS WHICH APPEAR TO CONSTITUTE THE BREACH OF PLANNING CONTROL

Breach of Condition No. 9 of planning permission 2017/2240/FUL failure to implement Landscape details as agreed under Condition No.8 (2019/0530/DOC)

4. THE BREACH OF CONDITION

The landscaping condition associated with Ref:2017/2240/FUL has not been complied with in accordance with the details as approved under Ref: 2019/0530/DOC. The condition states the following:

(i) Condition No.9

All planting, seeding or turfing comprised in the approved details of landscaping shall be carried out in the first planting and seeding seasons following the occupation of the buildings or the completion of the development, whichever is the sooner; and any trees or plants which within a period of 5 years from the completion of the development die, are removed or become seriously damaged or diseased shall be replaced in the next planting season with others of similar size and species.

Reason: In order to provide for suitable landscaping of the site in the interests of visual amenity.

5. WHAT YOU ARE REQUIRED TO DO

As the person responsible for the breach of the Condition specified in paragraph 4 of this Notice you are required to secure compliance with the stated condition by taking the following steps.

(i) Implement the landscaping scheme in accordance with the details as approved under planning Ref: 2019/0530/DOC (Appendix A)

6. REASONS FOR ISSUING THIS NOTICE

It appears to the Council that a breach of the above mentioned condition has occurred within the last ten years.

The requirements of the condition have not been met within the specified time frame. Repeated requests have been made to the developer to comply with the requirements of the condition. Despite numerous commitments to undertake the works required 4 periods in which the Local Planning Authority has requested the work be done have been missed these were the planting season Oct - March 2019-20, 2020-21, 2021-22 & 2022-23.

The failure to comply with the conditions gives rise to an adverse visual impact that would be remedied through compliance with the condition. Failure to comply gives rise to an adverse visual impact and is contrary to the provisions and objectives of Policy PS2 of the Local Development Plan.

7. TIME FOR COMPLIANCE

4 Months beginning with the day on which this Notice takes effect.



- planting areas should accord with the Construction Code for the Sustainable Use of Soils on Construction Sites (DEFRA, 2009), BS 3882:2015 and BS 8545:2014;
 - · Great care must be taken to preserve
 - with prior ripping where necessary to relieve compaction caused by tracking.
 - Areas to be spread with topsoil to a depth of All planting beds (but not tree pits) to receive not less than 150mm for grass areas and 300mm for planting beeds, above subsoil (300mm depth for shrub beds and 150mm for grass areas); topsoil allowed to settle prior to planting or turfing;
 - *All tree pits are to be excavated to a depth of 1100mm, and back filled with 200mm clean washed stone, 600mm subsoil followed by 300mm topsoil:

- Hedges to be planted a minimum of 400mm from kerbs.

- Tree pits to be excavated to minimum 1m x 1m x depth of rootball. In sloping ground, maintain horizontal bases and vertical sides with no less than minimum depth throughout. Break up bottoms of pits to a depth of 150mm and scarify sides. Pits to be backfilled as per detail below.
