

This active travel route has been divided into three sections.

This document deals with Section 3 - Walter Road (from the junction with St James Crescent to the junction with Calvert Terrace/Page Street). Please download the separate files for information on Sections 1 and 2.









Key elements of the draft proposals in this section include:

- Upgrading the existing signal controlled pedestrian crossing near St James Crescent (west).
- Upgrading the existing signal controlled pedestrian crossings near Bullin's Lane, Humphrey Street and Page Street, including removing the central islands so people can cross in one go.
- Removing the existing right turn lane at the junctions with St James Cresent (west), Westbury Street, Humphrey Street, Page Street and Calvert Street to help make the road easier to cross, assist with traffic calming and make space for the cycle track.
- Providing onward connections via Page Street, Nicholl Street, The Kingsway and other quieter streets to the foreshore, railway station and city centre.
- Making the footway wider to create a shared use path for both pedestrian and cyclists on St Helen's Road, between Nicholl Street and Page Street (to help better connect to wider routes).
- New one way system on a short section of Duke Street (section closest to Walter Road).
- Retention of existing established mature trees.
- As in other sections providing a **new two-way cycle track** on the south side of the main road, continuing walking and cycling **routes across side roads**, new arrangements for **bus stops**, new layout of **parking bays** and new areas of **planting** and landscaping.








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
Existing layout
