



**NOTICE OF CONFIRMATION OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER,  
HIGHWAYS ACT 1980.  
COUNCIL OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF SWANSEA.  
PUBLIC FOOTPATH 35, COMMUNITY OF PENRICE.  
PUBLIC PATH DIVERSION ORDER**

On 19<sup>th</sup> December 2019 the Welsh Ministers confirmed the above Order made under Section 119 of the Highways Act 1980. The effect of the Order as confirmed is to divert the public footpath running from a point (grid reference SS5000 8879) then for approximately 270 metres in a south easterly, easterly, north easterly and then south easterly direction to the end point of the footpath (grid reference SS5026 8875), to a line commencing at the same starting point in a more north westerly direction, then south westerly and finally westerly for about 265 metres to the same end point of the original path.

Copies of the Order and Map may be bought there at the price of £5.00 (quote ref. ROW-224/KAO).

The Order came into force on 29<sup>th</sup> January 2020, but if a person aggrieved by the Order wants to question its validity or that of any provision contained in it on the ground that it is not within the power of the Highways Act 1980 as amended, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act as amended, or of any regulation made under the Act, has not been complied with in relation to the Order, then he/she may, under Paragraph 2 of Schedule 2 to the Act as applied by Paragraph 5 of Schedule 6 to the Act, within 6 weeks from 17<sup>th</sup> February 2020, make an application to the High Court.
