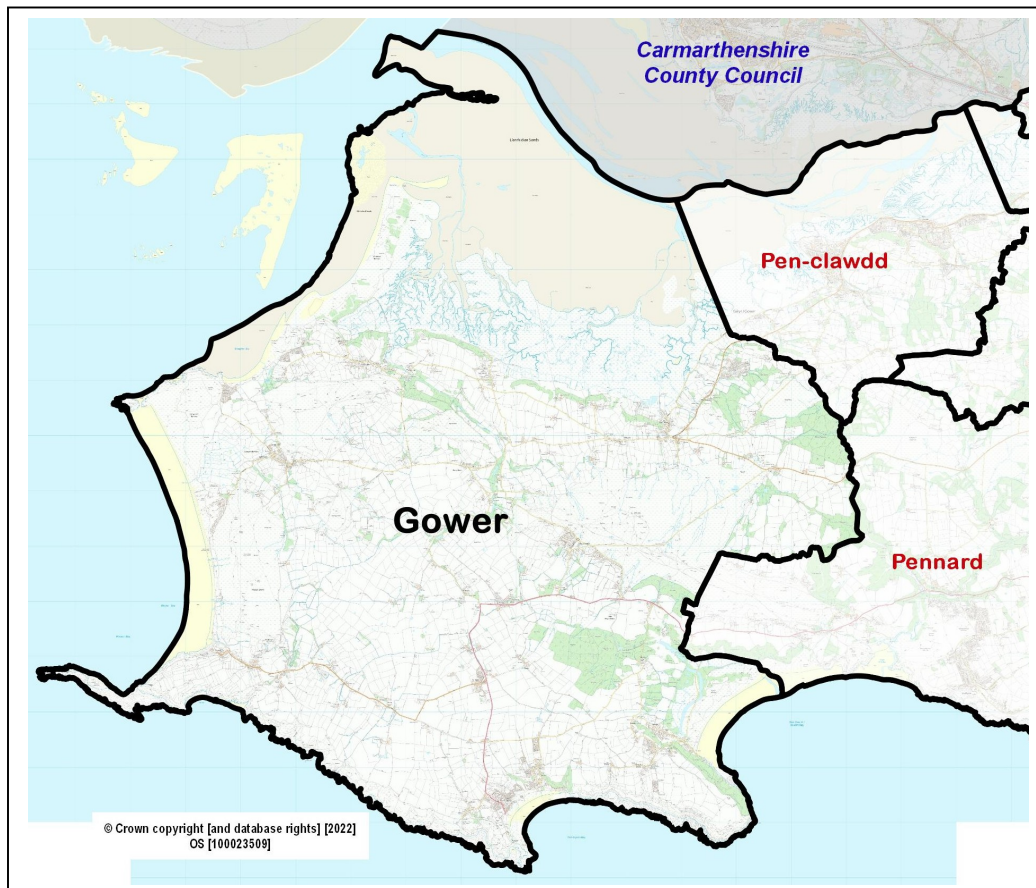

- **Location:** The most westerly ward in Swansea, and part of the Gower Peninsula. In 1956, Gower was designated the first Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty (AONB) in the UK for its outstanding landscape and coastline.
- **Adjacent Wards:** Pen-clawdd, Pennard.
- **Electoral Ward Review 2022:** Changed – part of the former Gower electoral ward has now become part of the new Pennard electoral ward.
- **Constituency Area (Welsh Government / UK Parliament):** Gower.
- **Population (Office for National Statistics rounded estimate, 2021 Census):** 2,900.
- **Area:** 93.8 sq. km. **Population Density:** 31 people per sq. km (ONS, 2021)
- **Employment (former ward, ONS workplace estimate, 2021):** 1,000. Major employers: tourism, agriculture and Swansea Council (primary schools).

ABOUT THE WARD

The Gower ward forms the more remote western part of the Gower Peninsula. Until the second half of the 20th century it was largely made up of scattered small farming communities, each with their own distinct character. Suburbanisation has seen the expansion of some of these villages, although the strict planning regulations of the Gower AONB have restrained housing development. Many of the settlements have retained their historic core and are designated as Conservation Areas.

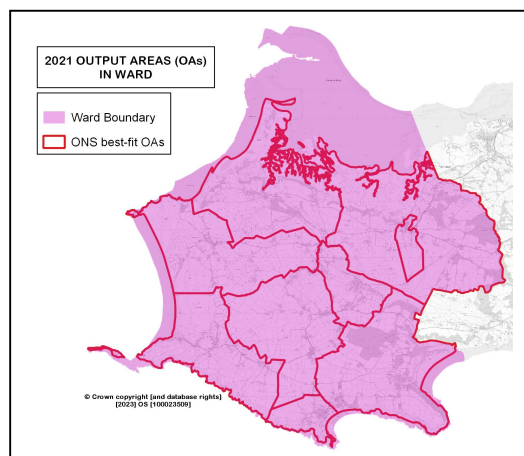
Due to the beautiful natural environment and restricted number of homes available, house prices in the area tend to be very high. Modern detached dwellings and converted character homes make up the majority of the upper end of the housing market.

The area is renowned for its scenic quality, particularly the coastline and prominent open hills, its sea and coastal views. Gower is extremely important for coastal recreation and tourism, including camping, surfing, sailing, swimming and walking on the coast and uplands.

Summary

- Lower proportions of young children (aged 0-4) and people aged 16-44 years.

- High percentage of older and married or civil partnership couple households.
- High percentage of detached accommodation and owned outright housing tenure.
- Proportion of adults who are retired or self-employed above Swansea average.

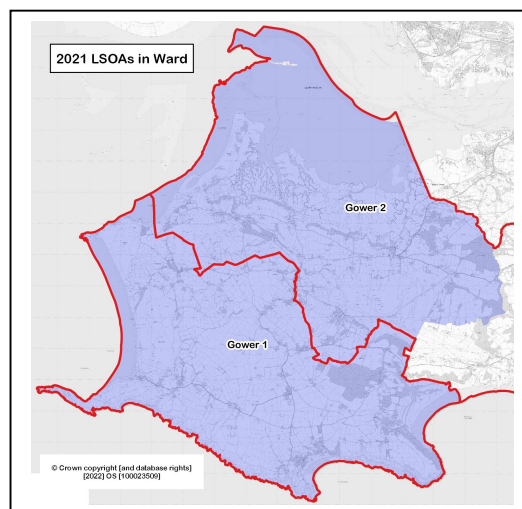
