


LLANSAMLET WARD PROFILE: July 2023



Councillors (Elected May 2022): Ryland Doyle (Labour – 2,233); Penny Matthews (Labour – 2,110); Matthew Jones (Labour – 1,924); Alyson Pugh (Labour – 1,862). *Turnout* (2022) = 28%. *Electorate*: 11,390.



- **Location**: Approximately 6.5 kilometres north-east of the city, consisting of the Glais, Trallwn, Birchgrove and Llansamlet localities, and the Enterprise Park / Swansea Vale.
- Adjacent Wards (Swansea): Bôn-y-maen, Landore, Morriston, Clydach.
- Electoral Ward Review 2022: No change.
- Constituency Area (Welsh Government / UK Parliament): Swansea East.
- Population (Office for National Statistics rounded estimate, 2021 Census): 14,900.
- Area: 16.2 sq. km. Population Density: 919 people per sq. km (ONS, 2021)
- **Employment** (former ward, ONS workplace estimate, 2021): 16,000. Major employers: Royal Mail, DVLA, Land Registry, NHS Direct, Virgin Media, Enterprise Park and Swansea Vale businesses, Asda, Tesco, Swansea Council (schools).

ABOUT THE WARD

The settlement of Llansamlet dates back to the 1700s. By the mid-19th Century, collieries in Llansamlet were exporting 70,000 tons of coal a year. This was followed by numerous copper and zinc smelting plants, which survived well into the 20th Century. The nature and intensity of industrial development in Llansamlet left behind a heavily polluted landscape.


Llansamlet ward encompasses the mainly commercial localities of Enterprise Park (designated 1981) and Swansea Vale in the west and south areas of the ward, plus the densely populated Trallwn, Llansamlet and Tal-y-Copa communities in the south-east part and the more rural Birchgrove and Glais to the east and north respectively.

Worker houses in these localities were largely replaced by post-war semi-detached housing, including a large Council estate in Trallwn. Much of Birchgrove's housing was built post-war, in estates of mostly semi-detached houses, with areas also developed throughout the 1990s and more recently. Glais is characterised by lower density, generally detached houses.

Summary

- 2nd highest ward population in Swansea, but 13th lowest population density (2021).
- Relatively high proportion of people aged 0-15 and 25-44 years
- Lower percentages of people aged 16-24 and 75+ years.
- Higher proportions of people born in the UK, able to speak Welsh and in good health.
- Larger percentage of single family couple households.
- Higher proportions of detached and semi-detached housing types, and owned with a mortgage or loan.
- > Higher percentage of economically active resident adults and employees.


WELSH INDEX OF MULTIPLE DEPRIVATION (WIMD)
