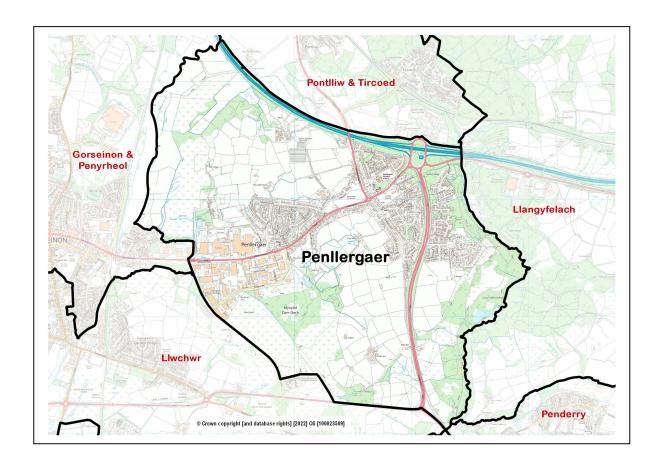


PENLLERGAER WARD PROFILE

Councillor (Electoral vote, May 2022): Wendy Fitzgerald (Independents@Swansea – 971). *Turnout = 41%. Electorate (May 2022): 2,688*



- Location: Approximately 9 kilometres north-west of Swansea city centre, adjacent and south of the M4 motorway, with access via Junction 47.
- Adjacent Wards: Pontlliw & Tircoed, Llangyfelach, Penderry, Llwchwr, Gorseinon & Penyrheol.
- Electoral Ward Review 2022: No change.
- Constituency Area (Welsh Government / UK Parliament): Gower.
- Population (Office for National Statistics rounded estimate, 2021 Census): 3,600.
- Area: 6.1 sq. km. Population Density: 583 people per sq. km (ONS, 2021)
- **Employment** (former ward, ONS workplace estimate, 2021): 1,500. Major employers: 3M UK plc, Garngoch Industrial Estate occupiers.

ABOUT THE WARD

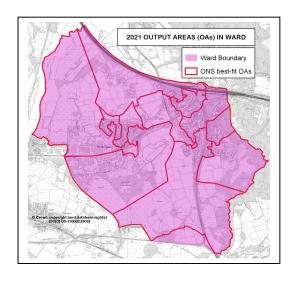
Penllergaer is now a well-established settlement with a number of distinct sub-areas, although most of the ward's land area is rural. A post-war Council housing estate was developed on the northern side of Gorseinon Road, and the area became increasingly popular in the 1980s, being seen as offering an attractive and less expensive alternative to the West Swansea housing market.

More recent major residential developments include the Parc Penllergaer site, which has a direct access off Swansea Road, together with further housing east of Pontarddulais Road. The area offers a range of property types with a proportionately large number of modern homes, where proximity to the M4 is important for commuters.

Summary

- > 10th smallest ward population in Swansea, and 11th lowest population density (2021).
- ➤ Slightly higher proportions of children aged 0-15 and people aged 25-44.
- Lower proportions of people aged 65+ years.
- Higher proportions of people able to speak Welsh, in good health and with higher level qualifications.
- Higher average household size and percentage of couple households.
- Larger proportions of detached and semi-detached housing.
- Higher percentages of economically active and employed adults.

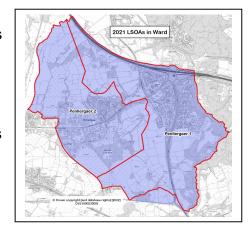
