


TOWNHILL WARD PROFILE: July 2023



Councillors (Electoral vote, May 2022): Cyril Anderson (Labour – 955); Lesley Walton (Labour – 903); David Hopkins (Labour – 900). *Turnout = 21%. Electorate: 5,926.*



- Location: Approximately 1 kilometre north west of Swansea city centre, consisting of the Townhill and Mayhill localities.
- Adjacent Wards: Cwmbwrla, Castle, Uplands, Cockett.
- Electoral Ward Review 2022: No change.
- Constituency area (Welsh Government / UK Parliament): Swansea West.
- Population (Office for National Statistics rounded estimate, 2021 Census): 8,800.
- Area: 1.8 sq. km. Population Density: 4,800 people per sq. km (ONS, 2021)
- Employment (former ward, ONS workplace estimate, 2021): 700. Major employers: Swansea Council (primary schools, community services), Phoenix Centre / Hill Community Development Trust.


ABOUT THE WARD

Townhill ward is located on the steep hill of the same name and overlooks the city centre, the SA1/docklands area and Swansea Bay. The ward was designated as a 'Communities First' area by the Welsh Government (until the programme's end in March 2018) in recognition of long-term social and economic disadvantage. It is comprised of the communities of Townhill and Mayhill, often known collectively as 'the Hill'. The area is dominated by inter-War council housing. Despite the impact of right-to-buy legislation from 1980 to 2019, levels of owner occupation remain fairly low. Private houses for sale in Townhill are generally priced well below the Swansea average.

Summary

- > 12th highest ward population in Swansea, and 4th highest population density (2021).
- High proportion of young children and young people (0-15 years).
- Lower proportions of people aged 16-24 and over 45, especially those aged 65+.
- ➤ Higher proportions of people born outside the UK, in a non-white ethnic group, and with no qualifications.
- Higher percentages of lone parent family and cohabiting couple family households.
- Higher proportions of semi-detached and terraced housing, and households renting from the Council.
- Higher rates of unemployment and economic inactivity, including the 'Looking after home or family' and 'Long-term sick or disabled' categories.


