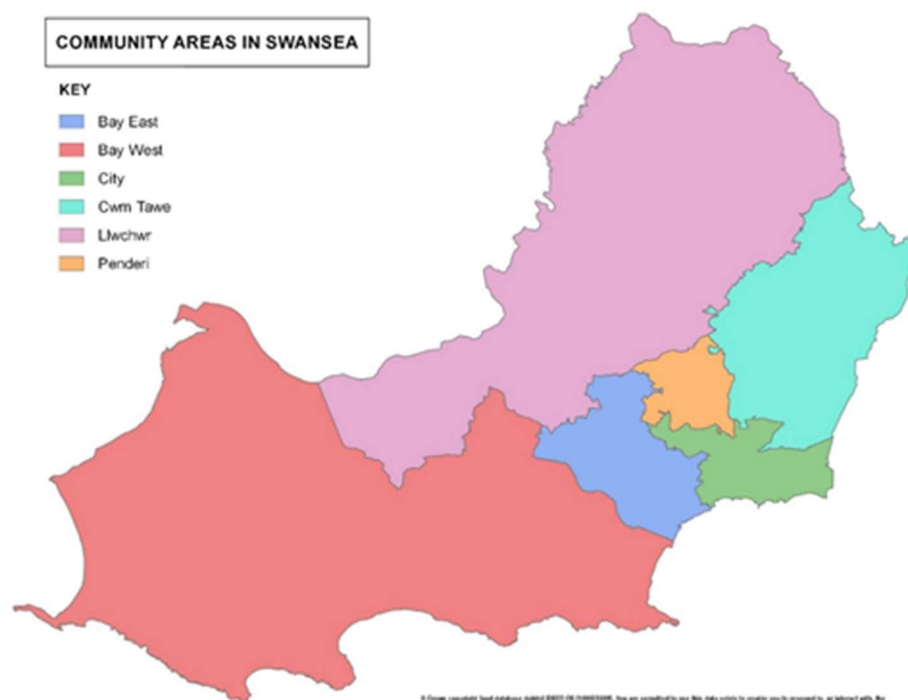
- Bay East
